

Know Your State Capitals Challenge Study Aid

Below is a list of states and their capitals to aid your study. Remember, you need to pass the Know Your States Challenge during weeks 1 or 2 before you may take the Know Your State Capitals Challenge. Only one test will be given during a test session.

Grades 4-6 will need to write the state's capital next to the state name. You will be given a list of states but <u>not</u> a list of capitals.

Kindergarten – **Third Grade** will be given a list of states and a list of capitals. Students will need to match the two by putting the correct number in the blank next to the state name. Kindergartners may have the test read to them.

Sample tests will be posted on the multipurpose room bulletin board by mid-January. Please note that our nation's capital is included on this test.
